Clayton County Police Officers Respond to Domestic Disturbance that Leaves Male Dead

11/11/2020 – Forest Park, GA (Clayton County)

The Clayton County Police Department Respond to Domestic Disturbance that leaves male dead.

WHAT: Clayton County Police Officers Respond to Domestic Disturbance that leaves male dead.

WHEN: November 9, 2020 at 1845 hours

WHERE: 200 Block of Forest Parkway, Forest Park, GA 30297 (Clayton County)

DETAILS:

On 11/09/2020, Clayton County Police Officers responded to the Chevron within the 200 Block of Forest Parkway in reference to a person shot. Upon arrival, officers observed the victim, Kevin Spruill, laying unresponsive on the ground with multiple gunshot wounds.

The investigation showed that Mr. Spruill and a female came to the location to pick up her children from Tony Stevenson who is the father of the children and ex-boyfriend of the female. A physical altercation began between Mr. Stevenson and the female over car keys, which resulted in Mr. Stevenson biting the female on the right arm. Mr. Spruill observed the altercation and attempted to calm the situation.

As Mr. Spruill approached the vehicle, the passenger, Reginald Hardy, began firing a handgun striking Mr. Spruill multiple times. Mr. Stevenson pulled the female into his vehicle and drove away from the scene.

Mr. Stevenson and Mr. Hardy abandoned their vehicle at a nearby hotel leaving the female and four children unharmed. The children's ages range from four to nine years old. The female later returned to the incident location. Detectives obtained arrest warrants for both Tony Stevenson and Reginald Hardy.
